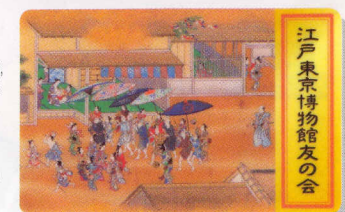

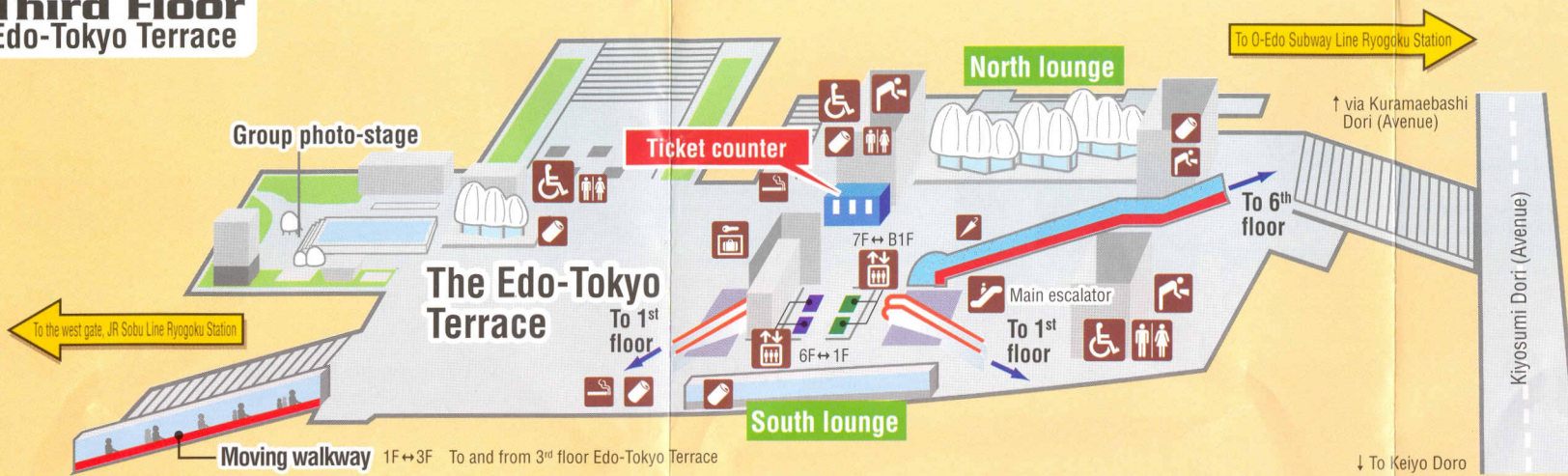
Edo-Haku Cultural Events

Third Floor Edo-Tokyo Terrace

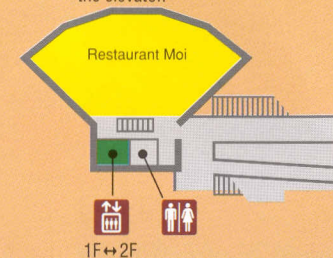


Fourth Floor

Visitors who wish to go to Restaurant Moi, please use the stair way next to the 1st floor Tokyo Modern-Tei Restaurant or the elevator.

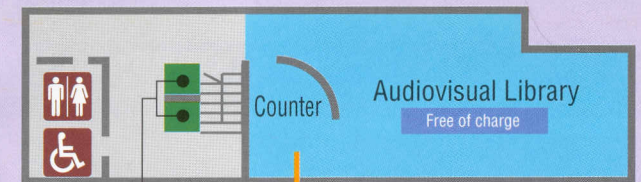

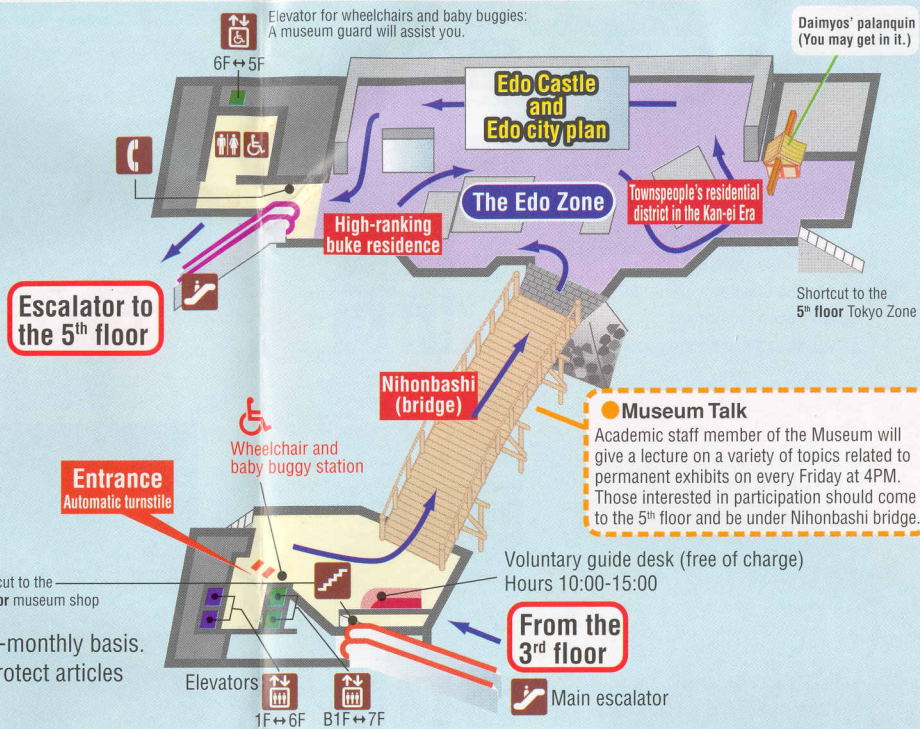
Sixth Floor Permanent Exhibition Area



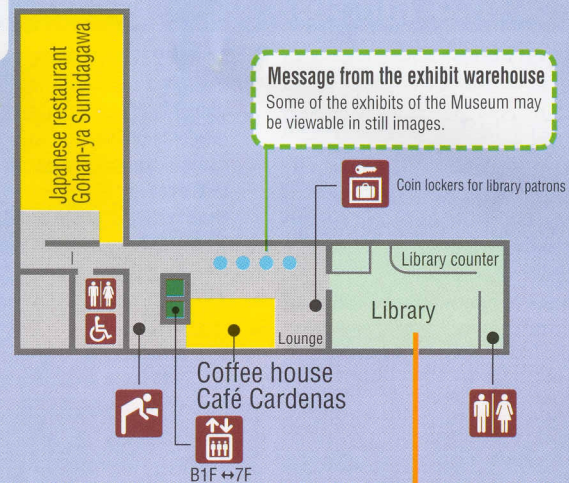
Entrance to permanent exhibition area
